**THE WORD**

Our life’s vocation is more often given to us than chosen or wished into being, whether it be the needs of parenting or the labors we take on each day, or even the vocation of simply being a child. The challenge at every age seems to be to live life as it calls us and not to wish it into oblivion, as if such wishes could be the ticket to a new and different rollercoaster, one more exciting or, for others, perhaps more tame.

So when we ask our children, “What would you like to be when you grow up?” it may be more nurturing to ask, “What do you think life would like you to be?” And when we ask young adults, “What are you going to do with your life?” it may be more helpful to invite them to consider, “What do you suppose life is going to do with you?” Different answers may drift into our awareness when we change the wording of our questions.

The fact is we can spend too much time wishing and trying to be something other than what life/God wants us to be. It is a great temptation simply because often it looks more glamorous or less painful. It was also the temptation of Jesus, as Luke’s Gospel tells the tale. The religious leaders sneered, “He saved others, let him save himself” (Luke 23:35). And the soldiers jeered, “Save yourself!” (23:37). And one of the criminals ridiculed him and cried out, “save yourself and us” (23:39). For Jesus, it became the temptation to choose a calling other than the one given – it was the temptation to save Himself. If you and I call Him king, it is because He was faithful to His calling, not to save Himself, but to save us.
