**THE WORD**

Do you remember *Wonder Bread*? The ad campaign from decades ago trumpeted the claim that it "helped build strong bodies twelve ways." I can't remember exactly how it did this, but the claim stays with me. What stays with me is not that it tasted good or bad, but that it was rather bland. But when you are hungry...

The people in today's readings are hungry, both the grumbling crowd that Moses faced out in the desert, and the crowd that Jesus filled when he fed them up on the mountain, who tracked him down the next day, going by boat to the lakeside town of Capernaum. In both cases, the people wanted more food.

In both cases, God acted to feed the people. For the Israelites in the desert, God provided manna (a word that literally means "what is it?"), which most likely was the juice secreted by certain desert insects after eating the desert bushes – a form of "bug juice," sweet, but short-lived. God provided this for Israel during their entire time in the desert. Not much variety, it would seem, but no one starved either.

When the crowd comes to Jesus looking for another course of barley bread, Jesus directs their attention to a deeper hunger that can be satisfied only by the "true bread from heaven" (John 6:32), himself: "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger"(6:35).

Paul calls on us to put on a new self, one "created in God's way in righteousness and holiness of truth" (Ephesians 4:24). This deep inner growth into a new self will demand more than "bug juice"; only bread from heaven that gives eternal life will do.

**Year of the Priest**

On June 19, 2009, Pope Benedict XVI declared the opening of the "Year of the Priests" and proclaimed St. John Vianney, the Cure of Ars, as universal patron of priests, a "true example of a priest at the service of the flock of Christ."

August 4 marks the 150th anniversary of the death of this holy priest known for his simple, direct preaching and his extraordinary ministry of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

He attracted great crowds for his "little catechisms;" short teachings that were simple to understand, filled with imagery drawn from daily life, and infused with faith, common sense, and remarkable spiritual insight.

St. John Vianney will be honored Saturday, August 1st through his feast day, Tuesday, August 4th, at St. Joseph Cathedral. All members of our Diocese are welcome to join in this beautiful celebration after every Mass when the Holy Relic of the beloved Saint will be exposed on the altar of the Terce Chapel for veneration and private prayer.
