**THE WORD**

Joshua/Jesus means "God saves." The first Joshua was the servant of Moses who ended up leading the Israelites into the Promised Land. God chose him as Moses' successor and he received the Spirit of God when Moses laid his hands on him. In today's first reading, Joshua calls the people to renew their fidelity to the covenant with God. The people are united in their choice.

A choice is also made in today's Gospel. (It may be helpful to read all of Chapter 6 of the Gospel of Saint John in order to appreciate what is happening here, what is being rejected or accepted.) Jesus' words that we have heard over the last few weeks now receive a mixed reaction from the disciples present. Some say, "This saying is hard. Who can accept it?" (John 6:60). We are told that many of those who had been following him "returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him" (6:66).

But for Peter and the rest of the Twelve, there is trust in Jesus and what he has been saying. Peter speaks for them all when he quickly responds to Jesus' question about whether they too are going to walk away: "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (6:68). This is one time I doubt that Jesus was upset at Peter's impetuosity. In contrast to the story of Joshua, the people around Jesus are divided in their choice.

The choice needs to be made again and again over the course of a lifetime. Have you made your choice to follow our leader, Jesus, who has the words of eternal life?
