**Lenten Opportunities at Holy Cross**

*Every Friday:* Stations of the Cross after 11:30 a.m. Mass. **[Sorrowful Mother Novena will resume on First Fridays after Easter.]** Day of abstinence (no meat for those over 14 years of age).

*Deanery Reconciliation Service:* March 8th at 4:00 p.m., at Holy Rosary/St. John, 648 S. Ohio Avenue.

*Holy Thursday:* Mass of the Lord's Supper, 5:30 p.m.

*Good Friday:* Day of fast and abstinence.  
1:00 p.m. Stations of the Cross  
2:00 p.m. Good Friday Liturgy and Holy Communion

*Holy Saturday:* 8:30 p.m. Solemn Easter Vigil

**\*Fast = One main meal, two lesser meals, no food between meals for 21-59 years. Abstinence = no meat for over 14 years old.**

**THE WORD**

We begin Lent with the conclusion to the story of the flood in Genesis. The flood was sent because "the Lord saw how great was man's wickedness on earth, and how no desire that his heart conceived was ever anything but evil, [and] he regretted that he had made man on the earth, and his heart was grieved" (Genesis 6:5-6).

We might not think of God as having a heart that experiences different emotions. But the authors of Scripture were not so hesitant. God not only grieves and even repents, God forgives, searches out, and seeks. Most of all, God loves. Indeed, God is love. In Noah's story, we see the heart of God change from grieving at human sinfulness to entering once again into a new covenant with humankind through Noah and his family.

Jesus was the man of God's heart, the one who revealed both the heart of God and what the human heart could be. Today we hear that the Spirit drove Jesus into the desert, where he remained for forty days and was tempted by Satan. But the heart of Jesus did not turn from the Father who had called him "beloved son." And so he went from the desert proclaiming God's presence among us – *now* – so that we would turn to God and believe in this good news.
