THE WORD

Pentecost offers us some helpful images of the Holy Spirit. In the Acts of the Apostles, the Holy Spirit is presented as a mighty wind, then as tongues of fire resting on the disciples who had gathered together. Both images are fitting for the One who literally blows them out of the house and into the world to begin the work of proclaiming the Gospel.

The image in the Letter to the Galatians and in the Gospel of John complements this first image nicely. The disciples are not sent out alone. They have been given a guide to help them to “live by the Spirit.” One commentary on this fiery letter of Paul noted that this is better translated as “walk by the Spirit,” suggesting a path. Paul clearly articulates two ways of walking: the way of the flesh, which leads to all kinds of destructive behavior, and the way of the Spirit, which brings us to the kingdom of God—and which brings the kingdom of God to earth even now.

The Spirit who guides us along the way is the gift of the risen Lord Jesus Christ. Coming from the Father, the Spirit’s purpose is to bring us to the One who is the Truth, to bring us safely home.
