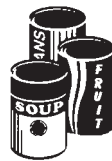

**THE WORD**

The responsorial psalm has a thoughtful verse today: "Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain wisdom of heart" (Psalm 90:12). A man approached Jesus asking how he could inherit eternal life. An inheritance can come to us by chance, as a windfall, or by right because of something we are or have done. The man was willing to work for this inheritance of eternal life: "What must I do?" he asked. And he must have been sincere because we are told Jesus looked at him and loved him.

At first, when Jesus told him what he had to do, the man came back with a quick "Already taken care of." But when Jesus moved up to the next category of higher demand, "sell what you have and give to the poor," the man walked away sad, "for he had many possessions," we are told (Mark 10:21, 22).

"It's hard if you have a lot of stuff," Jesus later tells Simon. It weighs you down. You just can't get through the gate. Like trying to get through a subway turnstile with a lot of baggage. Only God can make it possible. But the promise is that God will make it profitable to take the narrow way, not in terms of things, but in terms of family and a place to call home even now.

Gaining wisdom of heart means acquiring what Solomon speaks of in the first reading. Riches are nothing compared to the gifts of the Spirit of wisdom: "all good things together came to me in her company, and countless riches at her hands" (Wisdom 7:11).

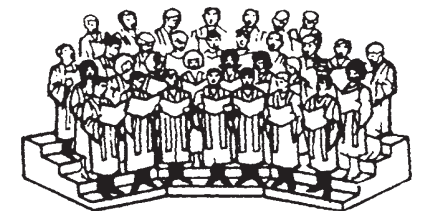
**Special Parish Dates**
