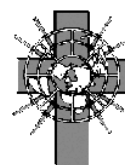
Repair Collection – Results

THE WORD

One day, after church, a woman went up to my friend who had just preached and said, "Father, do you want to make God laugh?" My friend smiled and said, "Sure, tell me how." She smiled and said, "Tell God your plans."

I think most of us have our "plans" now and then about how we want the future to be. Today we overhear James' and John's plans. They want to sit next to Jesus when He comes into glory. And their plans are at the top of their wish list. Notice how they approach Jesus: "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you" (Mark 10:35). They have their eye on the road to glory. When the others hear of this, they get angry at James and John, fearing that these two brothers have gotten an edge on them.

First, Jesus tells the two that they will indeed share in His suffering, but positions of honor are up to the Father, but then He realizes it's back to basics for the whole bunch of them. Once again, Jesus has to call them to the Gospel meaning of life. God's agenda is about serving the least, those most vulnerable, those most looked down upon. It's not about amassing power and prestige or getting the place of honor and privilege. If that's your agenda, know it's not God's!
