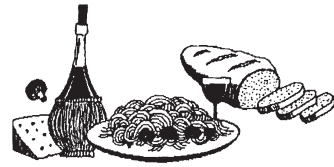

THE WORD

A great English actress told an interviewer about a time when she was in Washington, D.C. performing in a play. She had not had time to see the city, but on her last day there she had a few hours, so she went down to the National Gallery, where there was a Picasso exhibit. She only had about forty-five minutes, and decided that instead of rushing through the exhibit she would spend time on just one painting. She noted, "After about forty minutes, I began to see it."

Mark's Gospel often reminds us how difficult it was for people to see who Jesus really was. For the people, He was a miracle worker and healer. For His family and neighbors, He was just the carpenter's son. For the religious leaders and the Pharisees, He was a troublemaker who broke the law of Moses. For His disciples, He was the Messiah but not one who would suffer.

When Bartimaeus hears Jesus coming, He begins to shout out, and when Jesus asks what He wants Him to do, the blind man answers, "Master, I want to see"(Mark 10:51). Jesus recognizes his faith: "Go your way; your faith has saved you"(10:52). Bartimaeus saw Jesus in faith before he saw Him with his eyes. The final line confirms this when Mark says "he followed him on the way"(10:52). To follow Jesus on the way means to be a disciple.

Year for Priests

Pope Benedict XVI has declared June 2009 to June 2010 as the Year for Priests. Only God can fully sustain a priest in his vocation, but Catholics can also provide everyday support and encouragement. Here are five things you can do to help your parish priest:

- 1) **Pray For Your Priest.**
Encourage others to do the same. You might consider designating a daily chore or activity as a sacrificial offering for your priest. Or you might say a particular prayer every day for him.
- 2) **Participate and Be Active.**
The best thing you can do for your priest is to come to Mass every weekend and get involved in your parish. Use your gifts and talents to help the parish grow. Volunteer to help with whatever needs to be done. Attend parish events and support your parish financially.
- 3) **Watch Your Expectations.**
Sometimes, people have unrealistic expectations of what a priest "should be" or "should do." Accept your priest for the unique person he is. Trust God to work through your priest to meet the needs of the parish.
- 4) **Be Prepared to Believe the Best.**
A lot of what you hear on the parish grapevine is untrue or is, at best, greatly exaggerated. Until you have all the facts, it's best to give him the benefit of the doubt.
- 5) **Show Your Appreciation.**
Everyone needs affirmation. Thank your priest for giving his life to you and to the Lord. Recognize how much work goes into making the parish run well.
