THE WORD

Our first reading ends with Paul and Barnabas shaking the dust from their feet, after the Jewish leaders drive them out of the town of Antioch. It would be easy to conclude that Paul and Barnabas were writing off the Jews and simply going over to the Gentiles. We can forget that both these leaders were Jews and did not cease to love their people. Paul continued to go first to the synagogues and preach to them about Jesus.

Years later in his letter to the Romans, Paul wrote about his love for his people and acknowledged “great sorrow and constant anguish in my heart. For I could wish that I myself were accursed and separated from Christ for the sake of my own people, my kin according to the flesh. They are Israelites; theirs the adoption, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises; theirs the patriarchs, and from them, according to the flesh, is the Messiah” (9:2-5).

We see how Paul modeled his life on Jesus Christ, who loved His own until the end, whose union with the Father moved Him to see Himself as the Good Shepherd, sent first to the house of Israel. We are called to recognize the Jewish people as the people of the first covenant, the people from whom the Messiah came. There can be no excuse for any kind of prejudice or disrespect between Christians and Jews, Christians and Muslims, Christians and any religious group that seeks God in integrity and sincerity of heart.
