THE WORD

Jesus is not just taking a turn as Emily Post in today's Gospel. At first sight, this Gospel can simply seem to be a case of calling people to be more respectful of others of higher station. To the guests He says: Don't rush for the best places near the host, the seats of honor. You might end up embarrassed if someone else has a better claim to that seat. So be humble, take a lesser place, and let the host bring you higher. Such advice can really sound like a call to a more calculating kind of self-interest.

In a similar vein, he says to the host: Don't just invite the same old crowd all the time – your family, your friends, the ones who can either do something for you or who will invite you back in return. Instead, Jesus says, invite those who do not belong at any "respectable" Sabbath dinner – the ones who are outsiders, those considered beyond the bounds of society because of their physical, social, or religious impediments.

What is all this about? It is about being children of the kingdom of God, about being humble before the table of the Lord and about the needy to that table, just as God did when God began to form a people out of a lowly group of slaves in Egypt. This people God called to be the chosen people. So be generous now as God has been generous with you. "Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God" (Sirach 3:18).
