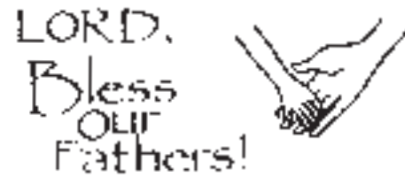

Peter's Pence Collection

June 27th

Next week our diocese will take up the Peter's Pence Collection which provides the Holy Father with the assistance he needs to carry out his most important charitable works. The proceeds benefit the most disadvantaged: victims of war, oppression, disease, and natural disasters. Through your generosity, with Pope Benedict we can cast the love of Christ upon the world.

THE WORD

The apostles were probably not very different from the rest of their families or their friends. They were not very different from any other Jew of their day. Indeed, given our expectations and hopes for our own leaders, we would not have answered Jesus much differently ourselves. They were waiting for the Messiah to come, and once he came, happy days would be here again.

They expected the Messiah or “Anointed One” to come in power and might; he was going to be a liberator like Moses, who led God’s people out of slavery, and he was going to be a great king like David, who brought the people of the northern kingdom of Israel and the people of the southern kingdom of Judah into one nation. The Messiah would usher in a new era. It was going to be great!

Imagine their surprise when Jesus rebukes Peter for saying that he is “The Christ [Messiah] of God” (Luke 9:20). Then Jesus goes on to say that he must suffer greatly, be rejected by their religious leaders, and be killed...” and on the third day be raised” (9:22). (I wonder if they even heard the last part about being raised.) But worse yet, he goes on to say that they must be willing to deny themselves, take up their cross daily, and follow him.

This Messiah would not get many votes, even now. But it is through faith in Christ Jesus, Anointed One of God, that we have become children of God. And we are called to “clothe ourselves with Christ” (see Galatians 3:27). Which is a more pleasant way of saying, “take up (your) cross daily” (Luke 9: 23).

Haitian Relief Update

Catholic Relief Services is proud of their emergency efforts in Haiti and their long-standing record of efficient and effective emergency relief. In the months since the earthquake, CRS has accomplished a great deal:

- Fed nearly 730,000 people and have distributed 10.6 million rations of food.
- Provided emergency shelter materials to nearly 90,000 people.
- Supported surgeons who have performed more than 725 emergency operations and medical personnel who have conducted a total of 59,246 outpatient consultations.
- Installed hundreds of latrines and hand-washing stations, drainage, and portable water tanks in 10 sites in and around Port-au-Prince and environs.
- Provide monthly food rations to more than 100 orphanages and childcare centers benefiting nearly 10,000 children.
