## THE WORD

A TV series featured an English chef going into an elementary school in Huntington, West Virginia, trying to change the children's eating habits. The resistance he first encountered was fierce. The children chose pizza over fresh chicken, throwing the beans and salad into the trash. Even sadder was the resistance of the adults: the women who prepare lunch, the school principal, and even the food supervisor of the school system.

We see Jesus feeding people in many ways throughout the Gospels: by His words and deeds, by His preaching, teaching, and healing. In today's account, He literally feeds a crowd over five thousand with five loaves and two fish. This event is a sign of God's ongoing desire to meet our hungers with generosity and life-giving nourishment.

This feeding reveals Jesus as His Father's Son, the God who calls people to come, eat and drink without paying, without cost. God wants to feed us so we have and share life with others. We can refuse both the food of God's Word and the food of the Eucharist, even when we receive it with our ears and mouths, by not taking it into our lives.

The word "heed" comes twice in the first reading. "Heed me and you shall eat well... Come to me heedfully, listen, that you may have life." God cries for us to hear, to listen "that you may have life," to receive the love of God revealed in Jesus, and let it nourish us into eternal life.

## DID YOU KNOW?

According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture...

More than 607,000 Ohio households – 13.3% – struggled to feed themselves last year.

18.2% of Franklin County residents live in poverty.

More than 1 in 6 Ohio children – 18.7% – under the age of 18, goes to bed hungry and not knowing where their next meal is coming from. The national average is 17.3 percent.

25.5% of Franklin County children live in poverty.

Ohio ranked 12th in the nation – tied with Alabama – in percentage of households having trouble finding enough to eat.

Research shows that children who eat breakfast have fewer behavior problems, better attendance and perform better on academic achievement tests.
