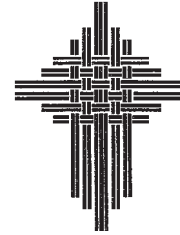

THE WORD

God feeding a hungry people is a cherished memory in the Jewish tradition. In his farewell speech to the Israelites, Moses calls upon the people to remember how God gave them food and drink during their many years in the desert. The manna was “something unknown to your fathers,” and the water flowed forth from a “flinty rock.” The water and manna were wonderous signs of God’s presence and care as the Israelites journeyed to a new land.

Jesus proclaimed himself as the living bread come down from heaven, bringing eternal life to all who eat it. We approach the table of the Eucharist to receive the bread and drink the wine, the Body and Blood of Christ made present through the power of the Holy Spirit. Again, something wonderous is happening.

We remember that Jesus did this on the night before He died, and told his disciples to “do this in memory of me.” When we do this, the saving event of Christ’s death and resurrection is made present in the broken bread and wine poured out for us. We enter into Communion with the risen Lord and one another.

Through our sharing in the memorial meal, Christ remembers us as his body and sends us out to witness to God’s fidelity in the past and God’s promise for the future: a world renewed, restored, reborn in the Spirit. God continues to lead us on the road from slavery to freedom, from death to life.

**EARTHQUAKE RELIEF UPDATE
TO HAITI AND JAPAN**

As of May 2011, the Catholic Diocese of Columbus has collected more than \$624,647.00 to assist in the recovery in Haiti. Catholic Relief Services (CRS) will continue to seek support for their recovery plan that will span five years and beyond.

Because of the massive earthquake, tsunami, and nuclear reactor damage that occurred in Japan, there continues to be tremendous suffering. As of May, the Diocese has sent \$245,000.00 to Catholic Relief Services, which is working with Caritas International and others to find pathways to bring aid to the many thousands stricken by the earthquake and tsunami that devastated northern Japan.
