THE WORD

In today's second reading, Paul recounts for the Philippians the pattern of humility and exaltation that can be discerned in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Unfortunately, the Church's Lectionary omits the verse with which Paul begins his account, in which he tells his readers, "Have among yourselves the same attitude that is also yours in Christ Jesus"(Philippians 2:5). The word that gets translated here as possessing an "attitude" is the Greek *phroneite*, which refers to the kind of thinking we do that allows us to know how to act in the world. It is not the kind of abstract "knowing that" that we use with regard to facts, but the concrete "knowing how" involved in living our lives well.

What Paul seems to be saying is that we should seek to possess the kind of "know how" that Jesus displayed in choosing a life of humility over a life of self-glorification. The radical humility that Jesus shows in His taking the form of a slave, in His willingness to follow the divine will even to the cross, is one that we are called to imitate in our lives. It is by our imitation of the pattern of living that Jesus has set that we acquire the "know how" to face even life's daily challenges.

When we hear Matthew's account of the passion of Jesus, we are called not to admiration of the love Jesus shows, but imitation of it. We may or may not be called to make the kind of supreme sacrifice that Jesus made, but we are all called to make our own Jesus' prayer to His Father, "not as I will, but as you will" (Matthew 26:39). In this way, we learn what it means to live as adopted sons and daughters of God.

– How in my daily life might I have the same attitude that Jesus showed in His suffering and death?

– When have I been able to pray, "not as I will, but as you will?"
