## THE WORD

Both the second reading and the Gospel give us an opportunity to reflect on “seeing” and “believing.” In the Gospel, Thomas says that he will not believe unless he sees the risen Jesus Himself. Jesus obliges him by appearing to him, but also says, “Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed.” In the second reading, the author makes much the same point: “Even though you do not see Him now yet believe in Him, you rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy.” In both of these readings, it is a willingness to believe what goes beyond the evidence of our eyes that is praised.

But it remains part of human nature to desire a sign, some evidence prompting us to an act of faith. In the first reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, it seems that people come to faith in the risen Jesus because of the kind of life that they see his followers living. They see people dedicated to living a life together, who willingly share their goods, and who break bread with each other “with exultation and sincerity of heart.” Because of the witness of the Christian community in Jerusalem, “the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.” They were the sign that Jesus was truly risen.

Even today it remains the role of the Church to be a sign of the resurrection of Jesus, which can prompt those who witness our love and joy to believe in the risen life of the one whom they cannot see. The Church is not simply a place where we go to be spiritually nourished; it is a reality in which we all have the role of serving as a sign of the reality of Easter.
