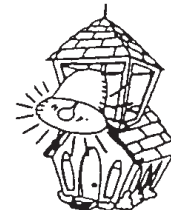

THE WORD

It is striking how confident Peter is as he hops out of that boat. What was he thinking? Was he thinking that walking on water must be easy since Jesus did it so effortlessly? Was he thinking that this would impress Jesus? Most likely he wasn't thinking much at all, but simply acting in his typically impulsive manner. We see throughout the Gospels that Peter's overriding impulse is to be where Jesus is. This is one of the things that makes his denial of Jesus after his arrest so shocking: Peter wanted more than anything else to be with Jesus.

This story also suggests that wanting to be where Jesus is can sometimes put you in a pretty perilous place. No matter how much confidence we may have when we step out in faith, we can find ourselves in deep water, with the wind howling around us and nothing but an abyss below our feet. We can find ourselves filled with fear at what might befall us. We might even begin to regret our impulsive decision.

Like Peter, when we find ourselves in such a situation, we must call upon Jesus: "Lord, save me." We must remember why it is that we wanted to be with Jesus in the first place: He is the one who has the power to grasp our outstretched hand, no matter what our situation, and pull us up when we are sinking. The choice to be with Jesus is always the right choice, no matter how perilous it might seem at the time.

– *What is a situation in which I have found myself in "deep water" and felt the need to cry out, "Lord, save me?"*

– *What perils do I face in my daily life because of my decision to follow Jesus?*
