THE WORD

The season of Easter ends with Pentecost Sunday. But the solemnities celebrated on the following two Sundays, the feast of the Most Holy Trinity and (in the United States) the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, might be thought of as “echoes” that resound from our Easter celebration. The mystery of the Trinity is revealed in the events of Easter, in which we are brought by the Spirit through the cross and resurrection of Jesus into the Father’s love. In Eucharist the risen Christ remains with us in the gift of his Body and Blood.

The feast of Corpus Christi, as this day is commonly known, might be thought of as forming a kind of bookend with Holy Thursday. On Holy Thursday we focus on the institution of the Eucharist in the context of Jesus’ impending sacrificial death. On Corpus Christi our attention is drawn to the abiding Eucharistic presence of Christ among us, the life-giving flesh and blood through which Christ remains in us and we in him. Many of the traditions associated with this day, including Eucharistic Adoration and processions with the Blessed Sacrament, provide an opportunity to reflect on the Eucharist as the “bread that came down from heaven,” the fulfillment in Christ of the gift of manna on which the Israelites fed during their forty years of wandering in the wilderness.

Ultimately, the presence of Christ in the Eucharist is a mystery. But it is not simply the mystery of how Jesus can be with us under the appearances of bread and wine. This mystery is part of the greater mystery: the mystery of God’s love for us. God’s desire to be with us every day in the most intimate way possible. When we say “Amen” to the minister of Communion’s proclamation “The Body of Christ,” we are saying yes to this saving mystery.
