**THE WORD**

On the whole, no one likes being described as “sheep-like.” It conveys not only intellectual dullness, but also a tendency to follow the herd and an inability to think or care for oneself. Rightly or wrongly, we think of sheep as needing far more care and protection than, for example, cattle, as well as a tendency to wander. As the second reading says, “you have gone astray like sheep.”

This might or might not be a fair assessment of actual sheep, but it is not the aspect of sheep that today’s Gospel reading focuses on. While the vulnerability of sheep to theft and harm is mentioned, it is their ability to distinguish the shepherd’s voice from the voice of strangers that Jesus emphasizes. Rather than dull creatures who will follow whoever happens to come along, sheep are presented as discerning listeners, attuned to the voice of their master, able to tell the true shepherd from the thief who “comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy.”

When Christians are called on to look to Jesus as their shepherd, and thus to think of themselves as sheep, they are not being asked to succumb to an unthinking herd mentality, but to listen discerningly to the call of Christ. God wants us to come to know the voice of Jesus, so that we will not mistake it for other voices.
