**Missionary Co-Op**

At the invitation of the Diocesan Director for the Propagation of the Faith and within the framework of the Mission Cooperative Plan, Missionary of the Sacred Heart, Fr. Vince Freeh, MSC, will be at Holy Cross to talk to us at both Masses on Sunday, May 25, 2014. Mission appeals directly remind us that the Church is universal and missionary by nature and presents us with an opportunity to share in missionary work.

**THE WORD**

While we believe that Jesus instituted the Eucharist at the Last Supper, all of the meals that the Gospels recount – from His dining with sinners to His feeding of the multitudes – can enrich our understanding of the Eucharist. The meal that the risen Jesus eats with His disciples at Emmaus is a particularly rich source for reflection. Here we see the risen Jesus walking unrecognized with His followers, trying to explain to them the baffling events in which they find themselves, and seeming to meet with little success. It is only when they invite Him to stay and break bread with them that they recognize Him. When He takes, blesses, and gives the bread their eyes are suddenly opened to know Him and the burning truth that He had imparted to them on the road, and then He vanishes.

The experience of the disciples journeying to Emmaus is our experience, too. As the First Eucharistic Prayer for Various Needs puts it: “as once for the disciples, so now for us, [Jesus] opens the Scriptures and breaks the bread.” The pattern of the Emmaus experience is reflected in the structure of the eucharistic celebration: we recount the words of scripture and seek to understand how they cast light on what is happening in our lives; but it is only in the breaking of the bread that our eyes are truly opened to the meaning of God’s revelation and the meaning of our lives. The Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Table form a unity; the scriptural word of God prepares our hearts to receive Christ, the living Word, sacramentally, and our reception of the living Word opens our eyes to the meaning of the scriptural word and to its implications for us.

Just as for the disciples at Emmaus, word and sacrament together empower us to proclaim the good news of the risen Jesus, to tell of how we met Him on the way, and of how He was made known to us in the breaking of bread.
