THE WORD

If your life ended tonight would you be ready to meet Jesus? Does where you invest your time, talent, and treasure make clear that living the values of Jesus is your number one priority? Or would they make clear that you value someone or something else more? Paying careful attention to how we spend our time or where we invest our emotional energy provides a good idea about an honest answer to these questions.

Sometimes the needs of those we love or our own livelihood require us to work more hours than we'd like. Sometimes the needs of those we love or our own physical or emotional needs require us to have less time for prayer or service or the activities that give us rest and refreshment. However, at other times our desire for more or our self-centeredness takes time away from what is of real value in the end, living the life of faith.

Why live this or any day as if it were our last? Because it just might be. Realizing our hope to dwell with God forever in the heavenly city prepared for us requires living the values to which Jesus, the prophets, and saints gave flesh, the values that can help us be ready for the Master's return, whenever he comes.

As the reading from Wisdom proclaims, knowing the night of Passover helped our ancestors in faith have courage to journey out of Egypt into the unknown and promised land. So too, although we do not know the time or the hour we will meet Jesus, we know that he has promised to return. If he returns today, what will it take for you to be ready?

– *What does where I invest my time, talent, and energy say I value most in life?*

– *What changes do I need to make to be ready to meet Jesus if he returns today?*

St. Teresa of Kolkata as of September 4th

Pope Francis will declare Blessed Teresa of Kolkata a saint at the Vatican September 4. Mother Teresa was widely known as a living saint as she ministered to the sick and the dying in some of the poorest neighborhoods in the world. Her simple service touched the hearts of millions of people of all faiths. Born to an ethnic Albanian family in Skopje, in what is now part of Macedonia, she went to India in 1929 as a Sister of Loreto and became an Indian citizen in 1947. She founded the Missionaries of Charity in 1950. Shortly after she died in 1997, St. John Paul II waived the usual five-year waiting period and allowed the opening of the process to declare her sainthood. She was beatified in 2003. After her beatification, Missionary of Charity Father Brian Kolodiejchuk, the postulator of her sainthood cause, published a book of her letters, "Mother Teresa: Come Be My Light." The date chosen for her canonization is the eve of the 19th anniversary of her death and the date previously established at the Vatican for the conclusion of the Year of Mercy pilgrimage of people like her who are engaged in works of mercy.

Tri-annual Collection for the Military Archdiocese

The Diocese of Columbus will once again participate in this collection to support the Archdiocese for the Military Services (USA). It is set for the weekend of November 5-6, and funds raised will support the pastoral ministries provided by the Archdiocese. Bishop Neal who did Mass on July 24 mentions the need for priest and the good work this done through the Church.
