THE WORD

When I entered religious life I needed a new credit card. My religious community's letter of application said that all the resources of the community stand behind me. The letter was talking about our financial resources. I soon learned that it spoke about much more. When I broke my wrist and needed surgery to regain as much use of my hand as possible, the community supported me physically and emotionally. I am an organist. Their support made all the difference in my healing process. I regained 95 percent of my hand's function and discovered that my relationship with the community was strong.

Today's solemnity and its readings speak about relationship within God and between God and us. Wisdom, with God from the beginning, plays on the earth and delights in us. Wisdom, made known as the Holy Spirit, has been poured into our hearts. Wisdom-made-visible is another name for Jesus. Everything the Father has is Jesus' and will be given us through the Spirit. Father, Son, and Spirit--one God yet three persons. Some name the Holy Spirit as the life force connecting the Trinity. Our readings make clear that the Spirit is also the life force connecting the Trinity with us. We sing this belief at every Mass: "Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory..... for ever and ever. Amen."

Created in the image and likeness of a God who is relationship, we are called to deepen our relationship, with the God who delights in us, dwells in our hearts

(even in the midst of affliction), and offers us peace. Give glory to God today. Pray and deepen your relationship with God, through Christ, in the Spirit. Invite others into this relationship by your words and witness.

Parking Lot Update

During my time at Holy Cross, I have noticed that there have been times that our parking lot is full and those people are not in church. We rent out 15 spaces for extra income. We will not rent more than those spots so we can have use of the lot for our events. I have discovered students parking in the lot and other business people using our lot rather than pay. It is not fair to those who rent a space or people that want to go to church such as what happened Ash Wednesday when the lot was full. Beginning in the month of June, notices will be put on cars illegally parked. Those that are working with Cum Cristo Center or St. Lawrence Haven, will have passes to display in the car window. It will not be necessary to monitor the lot after 5:00 p.m. and those wishing to use the lot for parking in the evening may do so. I would ask that you not use the lot Saturday till after 6:00 p.m., because of weddings. There are 22 weddings this year and a few Saturdays with two weddings.
