THE WORD

A few years ago I asked my dentist about a small growth on my gum. He examined it and asked if it hurt when pushed. I answered "No." He wondered if it got in the way of normal functioning. I answered "No." He continues to monitor it and will only remove it if it changes shape or becomes problematic. It took me a while to accept this foreign growth. Now it makes sense to avoid unnecessary surgery.

Weeds and wheat, bad and good, sin and grace coexist in life. News reports tend to highlight the former over the latter. People ask, "Why does God allow this?" Great minds have addressed this question. The most common answer: Without choice there is no real love. Life is what it is with both good and bad. We can choose to accept that both the weeds and wheat, the bad and good, are part of life and choose the good as much as possible. Or we can spend so much energy on the "why" that we miss the good before us. Like the growth on my gum, the less we focus on it, the less power evil has. The more we feed the good, the more we rob evil of its power and grow in trust that God's merciful love will reign in the end.

The Letter to the Romans assures us, "The Spirit comes to the aid of our weakness" (Romans 8:26). If we turn to God in truth, even when we have a growth that might need removing, we can discover what we need to accept, what we can change, and the wisdom needed to know the difference.
